### IN EDUCATION

### WELCOME TO MĀNGERE COLLEGE

Māngere College is a school at the heart of its community. Our students come from the surrounding area and enjoy a welcoming and inclusive environment here at school.

We prioritise academic achievement and expect that all students will leave the school with strong qualifications. Our focus on achievement has meant that our NCEA results have improved significantly over recent years.

We track each student through school to ensure that they are meeting their personal goals and progressing along a pathway that is appropriate for them.

As well as an academic focus our students enjoy a rich and varied cocurricular programme. Each year we have a strong involvement in Polyfest and offer a number of different activities in sport and the arts.





### ENROLLING AT MĀNGERE COLLEGE

Enrolments can be completed on our school website, and students and their families are welcome to come to the school office to complete the enrolment process.

Parents and caregivers who wish to find out more about Māngere College are welcome to visit the school.

#### **SUBJECT FEES**

Subject Fees are charged in some subjects. These cover the cost of materials that are provided for students to take home.

### **MC SCHOLARSHIPS**

As part of its tradition for supporting students in their education, Māngere College offers several different scholarships. Year 8 students who enrol at Māngere College can apply for an Entrance Scholarship.

At least five of these scholarships are awarded each year. They cover the costs of school uniform and stationery for the start of the year.

Application forms are included in every Enrolment pack or can be requested from the office.

In Year 10, Māngere College students are eligible to apply for senior scholarships (which provide financial assistance to students in their final years at school) and in Year 13 they can apply for leavers' scholarships (to support students in tertiary study). Local businesses and institutions sponsor Māngere College scholarships.



### SCHOOL UNIFORMS

Māngere College students have played a major part in modernizing the Māngere College uniform.

Year 9 and 10 students are required to wear the standard Māngere College Uniform.

Year 11, 12 and 13 students may wear the Māngere College senior uniform.


#### NOTE:

• Shoes must be either roman sandals (worn without socks) or black lace-ups.

• No sports shoes or basketball boots to be worn.

• The scarf, beanie, bucket hat, lavalava and jacket are optional parts of the uniform.

• The MC uniform can only be purchased from Māngere College.



### SPORTS AND CULTURE

Many of our students have real sporting success at local, national and international levels in a variety of summer and winter sports.

Māngere College is enriched by the cultural diversity of its students and staff. All cultures represented in the school are acknowledged in a variety of ways.

Cultural groups participate at the annual Polyfest Festival and often represent the school at special functions.

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### SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS

#### THE MĀNGERE COLLEGE FAMILY

Students who have visited the school and listened to Māngere College teachers and students talk about the school, know that they will be well supported and will soon become part of the Mangere College Family.

#### **YEAR 9 BUDDIES**

Student Leaders work with each Year 9 class to help them adjust to their new school. Year 9 students will soon get to know their 'Buddies' very well and can talk with them if they have any concerns or questions.





### DEANS

Deans support students to be in the right place at the right time doing the right thing, which includes attending classes and working hard in all subjects.

Deans will contact parents/caregivers if they have any concerns about a student. Likewise, parents and caregivers should contact the Dean if they have any concerns about their child's schooling.

### STUDENT SERVICES' CENTRE

The Student Services' Centre is staffed by a Guidance Counsellor, Registered Nurses, a Community Liaison Officer, a Social Worker and a Receptionist.

The Centre is open every day and provides a free service to Māngere College students. Student Services' promote the health and well-being of students at Māngere College so they can reach their academic and personal potential.

#### **GUIDANCE COUNSELLOR**

The Guidance counsellor provides confidential and on-going support to students and works with other staff to ensure that the pastoral needs of students are met.

#### NURSES

Our Registered Nurses provide a confidential walk-in clinic for students during the school day. They also offer full health assessments to all Year 9 students. Other health services available on site are a visiting physiotherapist, GP and Asthma Nurse Specialist.

#### SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKER

Promotes the safety for young people in their family circumstances, supporting improvement in their social and educational outcomes.

#### COMMUNITY LIAISON MENTOR

Our Community Liaison Mentor visits families to check on non-attending students and generally provides an effective link between family and school.



# CURRICULUM

THE BROAD CURRICULUM OFFERS STUDENTS A CHANCE TO PARTICIPATE IN A WIDE RANGE OF ACTIVITIES IN A LEARNING ENVIRONMENT THAT PROMOTES A STRONG SENSE OF WHĀNAU AND COMMUNITY.

### CURRICULUM YEAR NINE

### Students in Year 9 follow a core course consisting of:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- Social Science
- Physical Education

These subjects, and their teachers remain the same for the whole year. In addition, Year 9 Students have 2 subjects that change from term to term and are fixed in the timetable to ensure that they receive a balanced Technology and Arts Education.

### These subjects are:


- Health

#### Students in Year 9 may choose ONE language chosen from:

- Māori
- Samoan
- Tongan

- Mandarin Chinese

Students with recognised literacy needs are supported in enhancing their skills within all subject area.







### CURRICULUM YEAR TEN

### Students in Year 10 follow a core course consisting of:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- Social Science
- Physical Education
- Health

These subjects, and their teachers remain the same for the whole year.

#### In addition, students choose TWO options and one language:

- One language: Māori, Samoan, Tongan, Cook Islands Māori, Mandarin Chinese and
- Two subjects from Arts, Technology and Commerce

In general, students in Year 10 will continue with the same language that they studied in Year 9.







### RESPECT AND RESPONSIBILITY
