## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

And so another year has passed - a year which has been one of steady progress and achievement as the College displays its continuing growth and maturity.

A characteristic of this is the increasing number of past pupils who are moving into positions of prominence and achieving at high levels in their chosen vocations. In this regard it was very pleasing to receive from the Liaison Officer the list of those who graduated from University this year and to find that twelve former pupils achieved this distinction, one with a Bachelor's Degree in Food Technology, two Bachelors of Science, four Bachelors of Arts, one Bachelor of Commerce, two Bachelors of Engineering, one with First Class Honours and one with Second Class Honours, and one with a Bachelor of Law. Quite a record when consideration is given to the comparatively small size of our Seventh Form. Quite a credit too, to the teaching staff of Mangere College. As well as this, of course, many former pupils have achieved success at Polytechnics and in a great variety of occupations.



Most creditable was the performance of the Mangere College Table Tennis team which won the Auckland Table Tennis Association "B Grade" trophy. This is a magnificent trophy that is awarded each year to either an individual or team that excels in good behaviour, conduct and sportsmanship. The Committee this year has awarded it to the Mangere College team."

it can only ultimately be of benefit. We are seeing a much greater awareness and involvement in education on the part of the public and it is obvious that the education process is going to be a much longer and ongoing process for most young people in the future. There is also an increasing demand for many of the basic skills and knowledge which in recent years have suffered in the search for individual freedom.

This school, I know, will face up to the challenge which the new circumstances present and will continue to provide a very sound and appropriate education for our students.

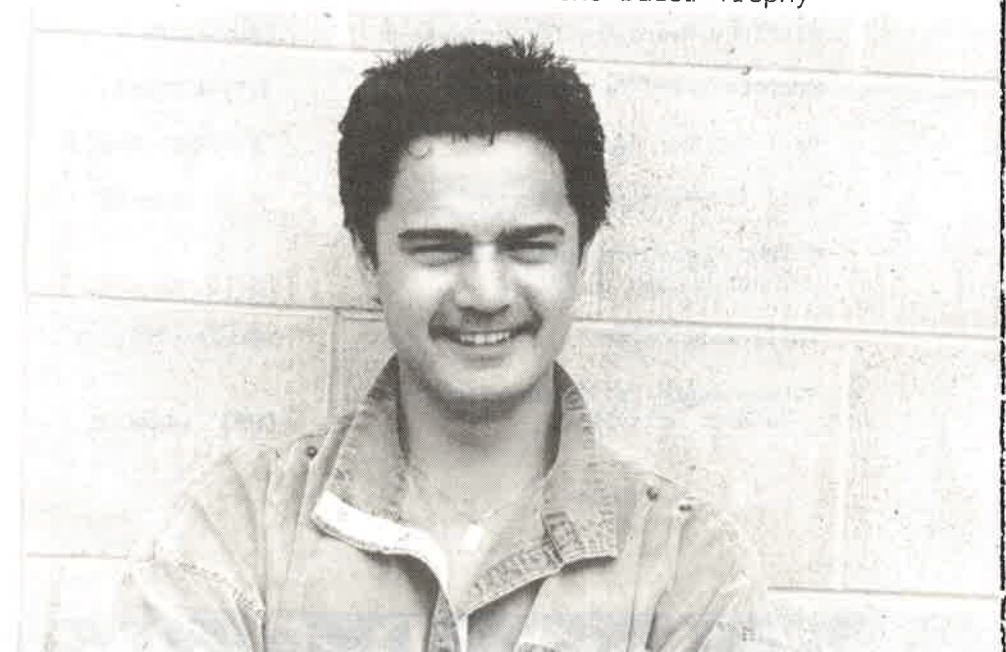
