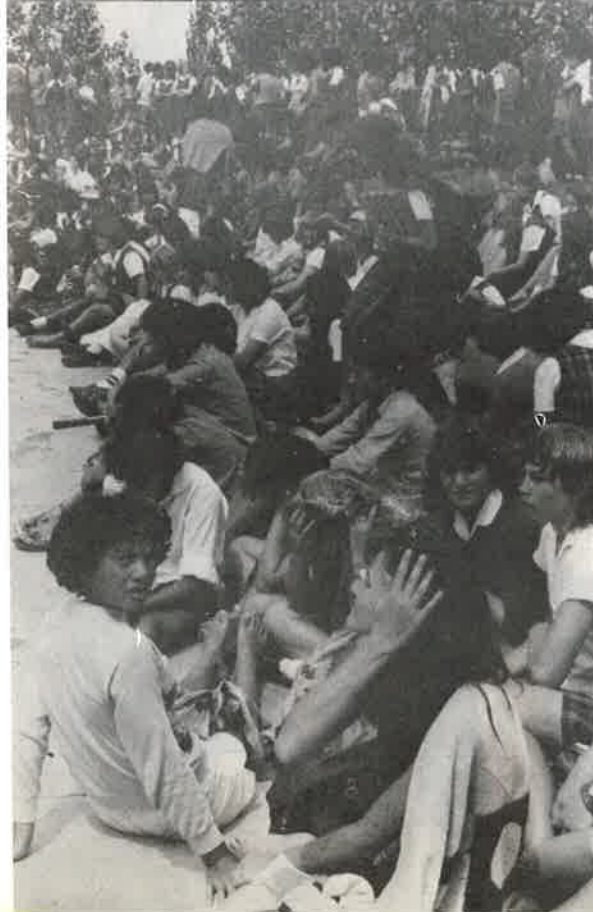

## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

One has only to travel overseas to appreciate what a wonderful country New Zealand really is with its wide open spaces, its beautiful mountains and coastlines and its rich resources for human achievement and recreation.

One has only to visit England with its 47 million people crowded into an area smaller than the South Island, or visit Japan where 114 million people live in an area only one and half times the size of this country or Singapore with 10 000 people per square mile, to appreciate the riches which surround the three million of us here in New Zealand.

One cannot but be saddened to return home after a year to find that the discord, disadvantage and distrust that existed before one's departure has not declined but has, in fact, become even more pronounced.

I cannot accept the view that economic circumstances are responsible, that we have our backs to the wall and that external influences are determining our way of life for I have visited many countries, much less well endowed than ours which are clearly more confident, committed and harmonious. I can only conclude that this situation is a result of a lack of direction, a lack of leadership, a determination on the part of many to be destructive regardless of the merit of a proposal and media, immature in their responsibility.

I look at some of the students who pass through this fine school and can only hope that the promise, the sincerity and the dedication that many of them display may, in the future, give some direction to this lovely land.

Congratulations once again to Asofitu Sauni for winning the senior section with a beautiful oratorical presentation.

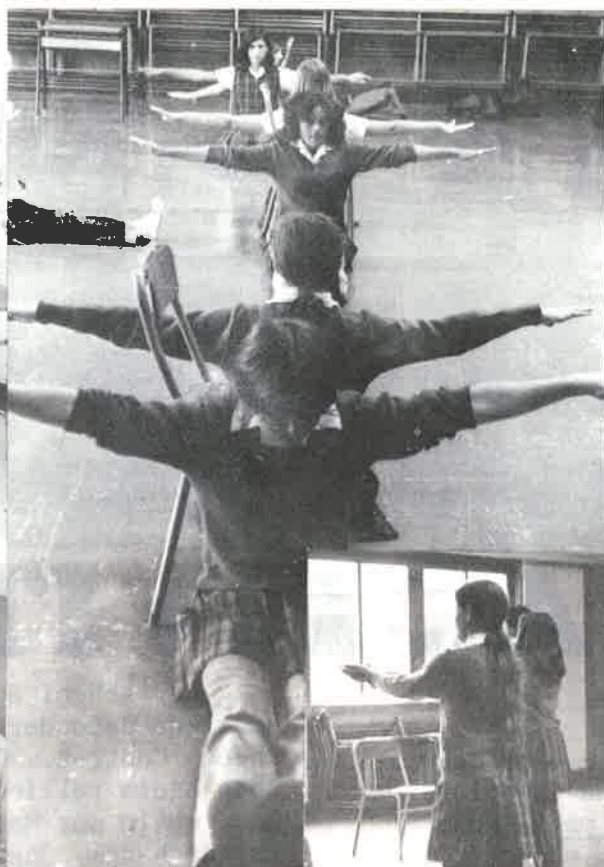




## OUTDOOR PURSUITS - MANGERE MOUNTAIN

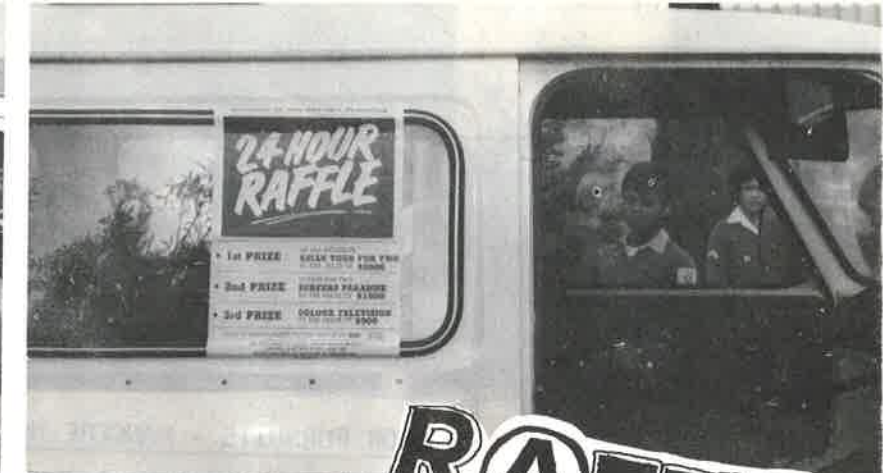

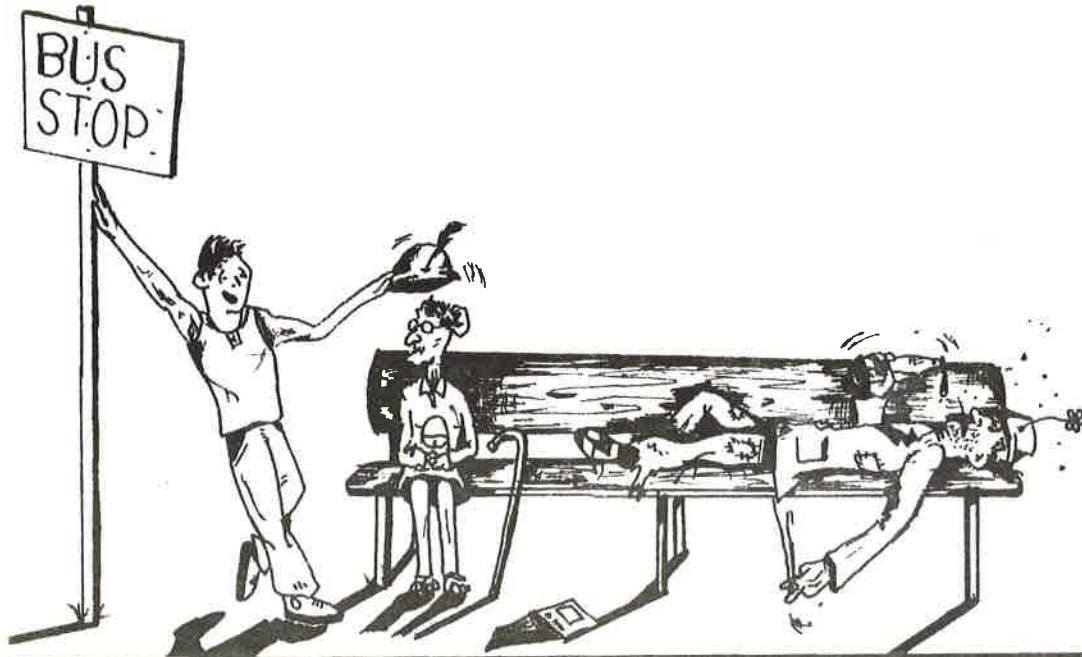
When she was asked what she would pass on to the young Maori people of today, she simply said, 'Hold on to your Maoritanga.'

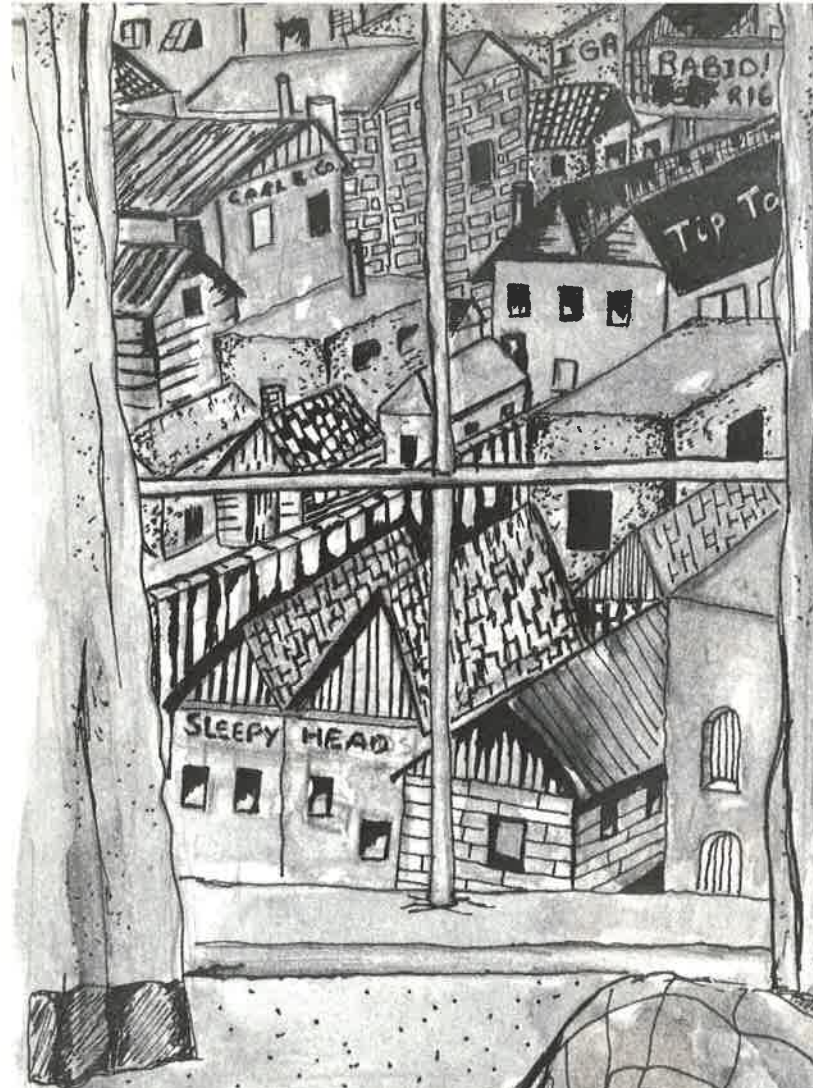
## I WAS ON MY OWN
